

AHS MUSIC BOOSTER MEETING MINUTES Date: November 5, 2020

Directors' Reports

Mr. Woomert – As HCPSS begins to explore hybrid models, I want to encourage you to work for what we will need to return. Wind instruments pose challenges to returning with in-person instruction. We will need instrument covers, disinfecting wipes for the music stands. There is other logistics that will go into planning a safe return. If we are in hybrid format the classes will be split in half, so we'll have between 13-20 in each band class at a time. That's more than manageable for the space that we have so I'm not as concerned about that, and I've begun planning what we might be able to work on in smaller groups. There's nothing we can do right now. However, I encourage you to take part in the Town Hall next week and pose questions to the Board & Superintendent about PPE for music students. HCPSM is staying out of it due to a split in its membership as to how the school year should proceed, so we need <u>you</u> to advocate for us and other programs for what we need in a return to in-person learning. Ms. Meloro – Choir singers are working on surviving virtual learning this semester, and we're doing our best despite multiple struggles involving technology and socialemotional wellness. We are slowing down the 'output' and focusing more on the 'input' when it comes to academic and musical products.

Mr. Posner – "Marching Band is finishing up with its final rehearsal on Monday. The students have worked really hard and the final products are in the process of being produced. We're hoping to have everything from the show and Carry On done for the Virtual Banquet on the 20th and will have a surprise production released in December. I want to sincerely thank all of the parents for their support of Marching Band continuing during the school closure.

Classes are going well. Concert Band students are getting better each day, and we're figuring out how to improve our system for rehearsal in the combined Symphonic Band/Wind Ensemble class.

- School Booster Meeting / Mr. Senisi Status. Margaret and Gisela attended the extended school booster meeting on October 21.
